



Transitioning from a STEP Work Placement to School Based Traineeships

Good Samaritan Industries have partnered with the Registered Training Organisation (RTO) **Kirana Training Pty Ltd (RTO ID 52247)**, to provide an opportunity for students participating in our STEP Transition to work program.

The STEP program STEP Program has been funded by the Department of Education's Non-Government Centre Support (NGCS) and is aimed at year 10 – 12 students' with disabilities, offering work experience in the areas of Retail, Warehousing and Business.

If a student shows enthusiasm, commitment and ability throughout the term of their work placement, there will be an opportunity to move into a School-based Traineeship.

What is a School Based Traineeship?

A School-based Traineeship allows a student to commence training for a vocational qualification, whilst earning a wage AND working towards completing their secondary school certificate.

GSI has the following School-based Traineeships available:

- SIR20212 - Certificate II in Retail Services
- TLI21616 Certificate II in Warehousing Operations
- BSB20115 Certificate II in Business



What does a School-based Traineeship involve?

The student becomes an Employee of Good Samaritan Industries, and works for a minimum of 8 hours per week. Whilst working, the student will be learning new skills. **Kirana Training Pty Ltd**, will visit the student at work one or two times a month, to assist them with completing work books and assess them in carrying out various workplace tasks.

How long does it take to complete a School-based Traineeship?

A School-based Traineeship is a big commitment. It can take from 12 – 18 months to complete.

How are Australian School-based Apprentices paid?

School-based Trainees will be employed under the GSI supported wage structure, which sets out their wage and conditions of employment.
